It's another miscommunication, but we're prepared to let the remediation be done properly.

To remove any possibility of miscommunication going forward and to put my stressed pregnant wife at ease, please list what's going to happen inside our unit in the proper order in the text of a response email. That way, I can show it to her in writing, and we can all finally be on the same page.

I even cleared our belongings out of the way this afternoon to help with the remediation -- moving weights and camping gear from the stairs, and our belongings from the vanity -- so we're just hoping for timely communication and transparency.

I wear an N95 respirator, as well.
